

**CITY OF LYNDON
COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
MONDAY, MAY 24, 2021**

Mayor Brent Hagan called the Council Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Those present: Susan Barto, Betsy Kramer, Carla Nalley, Camie Popham, Mardy Sidebottom, Amy Stuber. City Attorney, John Singler and Council member Becky Ricketts were not present.

A motion was made by Mardy Sidebottom, seconded by Amy Stuber to approve the minutes of the April 26, 2021 Council Meeting. Motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by Amy Stuber, seconded by Betsy Kramer to approve the minutes of the Municipal Road Aid Hearing on April 26, 2021. A motion was made by Camie Popham, seconded by Carla Nalley to approve the minutes from May 17, 2021 Caucus Meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

The Treasurer's Report was given and will be filed for audit. Balance for May 1, 2021 was \$3,328,460.59.

ORDINANCE #4-26-21A- 2nd Reading- 2021-2022 Ad Valorem Tax Ordinance – Motion made by Susan Barto, seconded by Betsy Kramer to have a second reading by summary of Ordinance #4-26-21A. Motion carried unanimously. Mayor Hagan gave second reading stating tax rate is \$.11 per \$100 of valuated property for year 2021-2022. Motion was made by Betsy Kramer, seconded by Carla Nalley to approve Ordinance #4-26-21A. Upon roll call vote, the following voted “aye”: Susan Barto, Betsy Kramer, Carla Nalley, Camie Popham, Mardy Sidebottom and Amy Stuber. No one voted “nay”.

ORDINANCE #4-26-21- 2nd Reading- Budget for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 – Motion made by Camie Popham, seconded by Susan Barto to have a second reading by summary of Ordinance #4-26-21. Motion carried unanimously. Mayor Hagan gave second reading of budget for fiscal year 2021-2022. Motion was made by Carla Nalley, seconded by Amy Stuber to approve Ordinance #4-26-21. Upon roll call vote, the following voted “aye”: Susan Barto, Betsy Kramer, Carla Nalley, Camie Popham, Mardy Sidebottom and Amy Stuber. No one voted “nay”.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: Mayor Hagan announced Shakespeare in the Park was a success with over 100 people in attendance. The splash pad at Robsion Park will officially be open on Saturday, May 29th. The next Caucus Meeting will be June 21, 2021 and the next Council Meeting is June 28, 2021, both at 6:00 p.m.


OTHER BUSINESS: The Mayor updated council on property issue that was presented at Caucus located on Jefferson Ave. regarding mite problem. Metro responded to Ms. Shaw but the reported issue was not addressed because it was in the backyard, not the front. They will return.

Council member, Amy Stuber stated the garbage can issue she reported at Caucus Meeting was a Rumpke error and they were delivered to wrong address. It has been corrected. Council Member, Betsy Kramer inquired about status of Lyndon Park Lane plans. Mayor Hagan explained Land Design and Development is still working on drawings. He also mentioned the event planner the City hired for festivals has changed their name to “Event Logic”. The festival, which will be in fall was discussed. Mayor Hagan also reported the train has moved from tracks between Lyndon

and Whipps Mill Rd, but another may soon take its place. He and Chris Lewis, legislative assistant for Metro Council District 18, have been in contact with CSX representatives and suggested other areas to store train cars.


