COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
MONDAY, JULY 24, 2023**

Mayor Brent Hagan called the Council Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Those present: Susan Barto, Betsy Kramer, Becky Ricketts and Mardy Sidebottom Vicki Stanley, Amy Stuber and City Attorney, John Singler. Carla Nalley was absent. Guests were also present.

A motion was made by Amy Stuber, seconded by Betsy Kramer to approve the minutes of the June 26, 2023 Council Meeting. Motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by Betsy Kramer, seconded by Susan Barto to approve the minutes of the July 17, 2023 Caucus Meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

The Treasurer's Report was given and will be filed for audit. Ending balance for July 1, 2023 was \$3,278,035.87.

ORDINANCE #7-24-23- 1ST Reading – Enacting New Sections in Chapter 110 of the Code of Ordinances Relating to Business Licensing and Occupational Taxation – Motion made by Becky Ricketts, seconded by Mardy Sidebottom to have City Attorney, John Singler give a first reading of Ordinance #7-24-23. Motion carried unanimously. Mr. Singler gave the first reading. In summary the city will collect 1% of gross annual salaries, wages, or compensation by those who work within the city limits. A second reading and action will be on agenda of the August 28th Council Meeting.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: Mayor Hagan announced Douglas Hills is hosting National Night Out, an annual event for law enforcement agencies at Warren Walker Park on August 1st from 5pm-8pm. Police departments from other cities, FBI and 8th Division of Metro Police will be there. More information will be on our Facebook page and the flyer will be emailed to the council. He also informed council, the City of Foxboro is having a neighborhood meeting at City Hall tomorrow night to ask questions about becoming a part of Lyndon. This meeting is for discussion only and if any council members want to attend, there cannot be any city business conducted. Mayor announced the next Caucus Meeting on August 21, 2023 and the next Council Meeting will be on August 28, 2023 both at 6:00 pm.

OPEN FLOOR: Mayor Hagan welcomed Claudette Patton, running for for Division 5 Family Court Judge who introduced herself and spoke about her candidacy.


