**CITY OF LYNDON
COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
MONDAY, AUGUST 28, 2023**

Mayor Brent Hagan called the Council Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Those present: Susan Barto, Betsy Kramer, Carla Nalley, Becky Ricketts, Mardy Sidebottom, Vicki Stanley, Amy Stuber and City Attorney, John Singler.

A motion was made by Susan Barto, seconded by Vicki Stanley to approve the minutes of the July 24, 2023 Council Meeting. Motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by Becky Ricketts, seconded by Carla Nalley to approve the minutes of the August 21, 2023 Caucus Meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

The Treasurer's Report was given and will be filed for audit. Ending balance for August 1, 2023 was \$4,615,109.73.

ORDINANCE #7-24-23- 2nd Reading – Enacting New Sections in Chapter 110 of the Code of Ordinances Relating to Business Licensing and Occupational Taxation – City Attorney John Singler noted a few changes to the ordinance since the 1st reading. Motion made by Becky Ricketts, seconded by Betsy Kramer to have City Attorney, John Singler give a second reading of Ordinance #7-24-23. Motion carried unanimously. Mr. Singler gave the second reading by summary. A motion was made by Susan Barto, seconded by Becky Ricketts to approve Ordinance 7-24-23. Upon roll call vote, the following voted “aye”: Susan Barto, Betsy Kramer, Carla Nalley, Becky Ricketts, Mardy Sidebottom, Vicki Stanley and Amy Stuber. No one voted “nay”. Motion carried unanimously. Mayor Hagan thanked council and how this will benefit City in more ways than one.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: Mayor announced the next Caucus Meeting on September 18, 2023 and the next Council Meeting will be on September 25, 2023 both at 6:00 pm. The KLC Annual Conference is also soon. Ms. Stanley announced she will be absent for both September meetings.

OTHER BUSINESS: Amy Stuber asked Mayor to confirm how occupational tax dollars will be budgeted in case the council is asked why the ordinance was introduced and approved. He stated that revenue will go into the general fund and budgeted accordingly. Initially, it will help fund current capital projects. He also stated increasing costs in service contracts and Lyndon's growing police services will benefit from this additional revenue. More discussion was held.

Mayor Hagan made the council aware of a potential zoning change request for a property in Lyndon to allow short-term-rental. The application is in the early stages with Planning and Zoning. Discussion was held. He also updated council on a new traffic plan for Bowen Elementary to accommodate the additional 150 car riders entering and leaving the school in the afternoon to alleviate back up on LaGrange Rd. The school staff visited those property owners who live along the route and sent out an email to families about the change. School staff and police will be working together in the weeks ahead. The Mayor added the school is planning to make a more permanent change and apply for money from JCPS to add infrastructure to school property in the future. Discussion was held.

Other topics were brought up. Susan Barto asked about updates on Bowden property. Mr. Singler stated Edward Bowden has a bench warrant for not showing up to court date. Other details were mentioned along with conversation about the shooting at Country Brook apartment complex and two other recent accidental deaths. Mayor Hagan reminded council about the upcoming Fall Festival on October 1st from 2-6 p.m. The Louisville Crashers will be performing from 4-6. Most details will be the same as past fall festivals including tree giveaway. Other details were given. Mardy Sidebottom inquired about Ormsby Lane project and Mayor said MSD is still holding up approval, giving more details. Amy Stuber asked about the intersection at Millbrook. Mayor Hagan said it's possible Metro may be repaving, including Ormsby Station Rd with the changes he has observed. Ms. Stuber also asked about closing with Pluris on Lyndon Park property. The Mayor stated the bank is holding up the process but he will not be planning for any more extensions. Ms. Stanely mentioned she was asked to pass along information about vandalism of Lyndon property on Ormsby. Mayor Hagan said he was aware.
