She believes there needs to be a traffic light installed to decrease the waiting time on pulling out of Ormsby Lane. The Mayor stated that the State Highway Dept. does not warrant a traffic signal there. She and Glen Stuckel, along with residents of Sycamore Creek and Eagle Creek have met with the State Highway Dept. about these issues.

Phil Worsley spoke on behalf of the Tree Board. He informed the Council they are getting ready to plant 125 trees. The Tree Giveaway on March 19th made some space for the new trees. He also mentioned to pass along to the ones who picked up trees, if they do not take after being planted, the City will offer a replacement.
