

**CITY OF LYNDON
COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
MONDAY, APRIL 25, 2011**

The Council Meeting was called to order by Mayor Barto at 6:00p.m. The Council said the Pledge of Allegiance. Those present: Jim Baker, Betsy Kramer, Carla Nalley, Cathy Robertson, Mardy Sidebottom, Tom Solley, Mary Watson and City Attorney John Singler.

Cathy Robertson asked on behalf of the Westmoorland residents if the Smart Sign could be placed on Lagrange Rd. again near Bowen Elementary. The Mayor will pass it along to maintenance men.

Tom Solley mentioned there were several streetlights out on Leyton Ave. The Mayor stated the City will need street addresses in order to call it into LG&E. Mr. Solley will get those address.

Mardy Sidebottom asked why the City Clock in the beautification was not working. The Mayor said she was aware of this and believes it is a power problem.
