CITY OF LYNDON CAUCUS MEETING MINUTES MONDAY, AUGUST 20, 2018

The Caucus Meeting was called to order by Mayor Brent Hagan at 6:00 p.m. Those present: Dustin Gilchrist, Betsy Kramer, Kelly Kramer, Carla Nalley, Camille Popham, Becky Ricketts and Mardy Sidebottom and City Attorney John Singler. Guests and Chief Throneberry were also present.

Mayor Hagan expressed his best wishes to those council members who filed for the upcoming election in November. He let council members know the police and code enforcement reports will be emailed to them this week. Chief Throneberry discussed theft logistics that may affect some cases in Lyndon that expand beyond boundaries. He suggested the council examine possibilities in the future that may change how the department will be billed. Soliciting was also discussed.

The Mayor discussed the contents of the next newsletter and informed council a gate was installed at the newly acquired property by the park. He also stated letters have been sent to businesses encroaching on the property in order for the City to install a fence and he is looking into quotes on gravel or recycled asphalt so vehicles can access the property safely. The KLC conference was also briefly discussed.

Ms. Sidebottom inquired about activity at two abandoned homes on Washburn Ave. The Mayor let her know Metro is maintaining those properties that are in violation. Discussion was held. The Mayor asked the guests if there were any concerns they would like to address. Eric Knapp from Oxford Woods claimed motorists are not stopping at the 4-way stop on Lyndon and Wood Rd. The Mayor said he would talk to Metro Council Member, Marilyn Parker, if they would consider installing solar-powered, flashing stop signs at this location. He also said the bushes will be cut back there soon as well. Robsion Park activity was also brought up.

Mayor Hagan gave an update on the storage building at Lyndon and Warwick. He had taken a few calls from citizens concerned by the look of the façade but he reassured them it was not finished. Discussion was held.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 6:28 p.m.
