CITY OF LYNDON COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES MONDAY, JANUARY 22, 2018

Mayor Brent Hagan called the Council Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Those present: Dustin Gilchrist, Betsy Kramer, Kelly Kramer, Carla Nalley, Cami Popham, Becky Ricketts, Mardy Sidebottom and City Attorney John Singler. Guests were present.

A motion was made by Becky Ricketts, seconded by Carla Nalley to approve the minutes of the December 18, 2017 Council Meeting. A motion was made by Betsy Kramer, seconded by Mardy Sidebottom to approve minutes from the January 15, 2018 Caucus Meeting. Both carried unanimously.

The Treasurer's Report was given and will be filed for audit. Balance for January 1, 2018 was \$4,363,694.71

Mayor Hagan asked Chief Grady Throneberry from Graymoor-Devondale Police Department to update council on any happenings or updates in Lyndon. Chief Throneberry reported a decrease in crime the past few months in Lyndon. He updated on the department, increasing officers and equipment and spoke about the drug epidemic.

Phyllis Frost from Lyndonwoods Circle inquired if the City had any news on 416 Benjamin Lane. Mayor Hagan stated Metro Zoning has not given any updates but urges neighbors to continue calling the police if there are problems. He asked City Attorney, John Singler, about conditions to make it a no-parking street. Mr. Singler suggested the City contact the fire department for support to make one side a fire lane since it is narrow and there have been parking issues here in the past during emergency services.
